

### THE OLD TESTAMENT READING

Acts 16:9-15

<sup>9</sup>A vision appeared to Paul in the night: a man of Macedonia was standing there, urging him and saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." <sup>10</sup>And when Paul had seen the vision, immediately we sought to go on into Macedonia, concluding that God had called us to preach the gospel to them. <sup>11</sup>So, setting sail from Troas, we made a direct voyage to Samothrace, and the following day to Neapolis, <sup>12</sup>and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city some days. <sup>13</sup>And on the Sabbath day we went outside the gate to the riverside, where we supposed there was a place of prayer, and we sat down and spoke to the women who had come together. <sup>14</sup>One who heard us was a woman named Lydia, from the city of Thyatira, a seller of purple goods, who was a worshiper of God. Looking ahead to the next month or two, I will be continuing orientation of course. Lucía and I have started reading a book in Spanish on the history of the Dominican Republic, which has been really interesting, even if we are only into the early 16th century. I have found that I know the vast majority of the words, which is encouraging. I also picked up a Harry Potter book to read, but that seems to be much more difficult, at least in terms of unknown vocabulary. We have also been doing things outside of the office for our class, such as going to the Claro office (the phone provider) or the new mall that just opened up. Those have been pretty fun and a good way to practice my Spanish. I hope to continue these outings so that I can continue to build my confidence and my ear (listening skills). Looking slightly farther ahead into August, there is the big LAC conference. This year is special as we are celebrating 125 years of LCMS mission in the region, so, instead of staying in-country at Punta Cana, the conference is being held in St. Louis. That will be my first trip back to the US, which is exciting. My parents are also looking to meet up with me during that time, so I am looking forward to that week even more!

Somewhere in-between there I hope to start helping people out as the resident technology guy. I have already had several questions about artificial intelligence from various people, so I am looking forward to hearing what other topics people would like to discuss, or just anything else that I can help out with. That is the reason I am here after all!


### Brief Outlook for the Near Future


